



FOREIGN MISSION SERVICE TRIP GUIDELINES:

Awards are contingent on the application of college age students (ages 18-25) who are members of a Benedictine

parish staffed by a monk of Saint Vincent Archabbey. Awards will be evaluated by order received and will be given on a case-by-case basis.

A limited number of awards will be granted for flight related expenses to and from Saint Vincent Archabbey's foreign mission location. The limit of the award is 50% of those costs.

The awardee is expected to raise the remaining funds (\$1,250.00) for the support of missionary activities while on the trip. Any funds raised above these amounts will go towards the promotion of the Archabbey Wimmer Fund. The awardee is also required to:


• Participate in service activities throughout the mission trip.

• Journal their experience, via social media, while on mission.


• Be available and participate in follow-up activities including writing articles, making presentations, providing photos, and other awareness activities. Applicants must have a letter from their pastor addressing their character.

Life is troubling. Who among us has not struggled with anxiety and difficulties, sometimes massive ones? I certainly have, as have many of my loved ones. If we do, does this mean that we don't trust the Lord or just need to toughen up?

I don't think so. How encouraging for us anxious and troubled souls to hear Luke describe the Blessed Mother Mary in these words, "**But she was greatly troubled at what was said.**" An archangel has visited her. An inconceivable promise has been made to her. Her life has become wildly unpredictable, perhaps more so than any person before or since. The first point for us: the Lord is with her *precisely when she is troubled*. Her anxiousness and God's presence are not mutually exclusive. Christianity is not about a trance-like robotic indifference. It's about the presence of divine love. Even in — especially in — troubled circumstances.


Our troubled soul can become our greatest treasure. What seems so troubling at first to Mary becomes the best possible thing, Jesus, the Savior and Lord, is now her son. All the difficulties and troubles remain, and yet her movement into the fullness of God is accelerated. What is troubling you right now? This scripture invites us now, this week, to hear the Lord's messenger say to us what he said to Mary, "**Do not be afraid! You have found favor with God**."


